



Proclamation

By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, the United States Warrant Officer Corps was established on July 9, 1918 and this year marks the 92nd anniversary of the corps; and

WHEREAS, the United States Army Warrant Officers Association was established to foster esprit de corps; devotion to duty among its members; recommend programs for the improvement of the Army; distribute professional information among warrant officers; promote the technical and social welfare of our soldiers; and promote a spirit of true comradeship among its members; and

WHEREAS, the United States Army Warrant Officers Association joins 34 other military member organizations totaling 5.5 million members seeking to support and preserve laws, funds, and policies which are fair and proper representation to service members, retirees, and their families; and

WHEREAS, the United States Army Warrant Officers Association acts as a focal point to receive professional input, suggestions, concerns, and general comments from warrant officers in the field and, after analysis, recommends approval, and presents these views to the appropriate officials; and


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bob Riley, Governor of Alabama, do hereby proclaim November 1 - November 5, 2010, as
