The USAWOA Scholarship Foundation Selection Committee spent a long hard day working on Saturday, 15 June 2013, and completed review of the applications we received for scholarships this cycle. A total of 52 applications were received, one was not qualified and disallowed. Of the 51 valid applications, we are able to fund fifteen \$1,000 scholarships this year, based on the availability of funds.

I want to thank CW3 Charles A. Conway and CW3 James N. Ryan for their yeomen's service, in evaluating and scoring the applicants. This is not a simple task and it grows in complexity each year, as the submissions become more detailed.

Through the generosity of many folks this year, either through CFC pledges or direct contributions, we are able to provide several different scholarships. We are awarding the following \$1,000.00 scholarships: two CW4 (Ret) Allnatt Memorial Scholarships, one CW4 (Ret) Calabrese Memorial Scholarship and twelve Foundation Regular Scholarships, for fifteen scholarships. This year we were additionally able to award one four-year Grantham University On-line Scholarship.
